

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES  
OCTOBER 6, 2010**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Wednesday, October 6, 2010 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Twine, Jernigan, Askew, Nickens and Jordan were present. Also present was County Manager, Toby Chappell and County Attorney, Pitt Godwin.

A prayer was led by Rev. Roger Kiker. Chairman Twine led the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Twine called the meeting to order.

**Approval of Agenda**

Chairman Twine stated the Agenda needs to be amended by adding item IV. D. Resolution for the proposed project widening US 13-158 in Hertford and Gates Counties.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to accept the Agenda as amended. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

**Approval of Minutes**

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 1, 8, and 20 Commissioners' Meetings as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

**Department Reports**

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendments 17, 18, 20 – 22.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve Budget Amendments 17, 18, 20-22 as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Renee McGinnis, Tax Assessor, presented the September Tax Collector's Report and presented a list of properties currently released to Attorney Travis Ellis for collection or foreclosure.

The Board requested Mr. Chappell, Mrs. McGinnis and Pitt Godwin write a policy for the sale of foreclosed property the County has assumed and return to the Board with the policy.

Mrs. McGinnis presented a Request for Tax Refunds to: Carlton E. and Rosalee Matthews, \$396.33, Owen and Leanna Tyler, \$991.59, LAC Blue Corp., \$332.38, Edward Lee Osborne, Harold S. Osborne and Richard Osborne, \$187.48 and Steven Jones, \$109.73.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the Tax Refund Request as presented. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. McGinnis presented a Request for Tax Refunds to Bank of America. The mortgage company paid taxes in error for a client that did not have an escrow account and is now seeking a refund.

Mr. Godwin, Attorney, suggested Ms. McGinnis inform Bank of America the funds paid have been applied to their client's 2010 taxes.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion not to approve the Tax Refund Request for the Bank of America. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine read the charge to empower the Tax Collector to collect 2010 taxes.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to approve the charge. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, the motion carried without opposition.

The charge reads as follows:

To the Tax Collector of the County of Gates  
State of North Carolina

County of Gates

You are hereby authorized, empowered, and commanded to collect the taxes set forth in the tax records filed in the office of the Tax Assessor and/or Collector and in the tax receipts herewith delivered to you, in the amounts and from the taxpayers likewise therein set forth. Such taxes are hereby declared to be the first lien upon all real property of the respective taxpayers in the County of Gates, and this order shall be a full and sufficient authority to direct, require and enable you to levy on and sell any real or personal property of such taxpayers, for and on account thereof, in accordance with law, NCGS 105-321(b).

Morgan Jethro, Planning Director, presented a request by the Planning Board to table a text amendment change to Section 8.02 Note 2. Variance for Prior Lots of Record, until further review. She also presented a text amendment change to Section 11.04 Extension or Enlargement of Nonconforming Situations.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to open the Public Hearing on Section 11.04 text amendment change. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, stated the replacement date of 120 days should never have been in the text.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to close the Public Hearing on Section 11.04. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to approve the text amendment change to remove 120 days from Section 11.04 Extension or Enlargement of Nonconforming Situations. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The text will now read:

#### **SECTION 11.04 – Extension or Enlargement of Nonconforming Situations**

7. Notwithstanding paragraph 5, any structure used for single-family residential purposes and maintained as a nonconforming use may be replaced with a similar structure of a larger size so long as the replacement occurs within one hundred twenty (120) days of the removal of the original structure and the replacement does not create new nonconformities with respect to yard size and setback requirements. In particular, a manufactured/mobile home may be replaced with a larger manufactured/mobile home,

~~and a "single wide" manufactured/mobile home may be replaced with a "double wide."~~  
~~This paragraph is subject to the limitations stated in Section 11.06 on abandonment and discontinuance of nonconforming situations,~~ manufactured home, or modular home, so long as the replacement does not create new nonconformities with respect to yard size and setback requirements. The governing use shall be the last structure on the site regardless of the lapse of removal of the structure, as confirmed by the Gates County Tax Department. The replacement of the structure or manufactured home may be ascending or descending in square footage. This paragraph is subject to the limitations stated in Section 11.04 on abandoned and discontinuance of nonconforming situations.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to send Section 8.02 Note 2, back to the Planning Board for review. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Ms. Jethro presented the CDBG New Housing Construction Bids. The bidders were R. W. Construction, Tim Phelps & Co., Eure & Sons Construction, T. R. Holley General Contracting, Godfrey Bros. Builders, Inc. and Kee Builders, Inc. The winning bidder was Godfrey Bros. Builders from Elizabeth City. The Board requested Carolyn Morris, Grant Administrator, Albemarle Commission, attend the November Commissioners' Meeting to discuss the specifics for construction.

Reba Greene-Holley, Cooperative Extension Director, presented the Growing Gates Economic Development Grant. The grant had been previously submitted. The Board has an opportunity to add additional funds but decided to review the grant further before making a decision.

Chairman Twine presented a plaque to Mrs. Holley from the U.S. Census Bureau for her efforts in completing the 2010 Census.

Chairman Twine called the meeting to order after a brief recess.

#### **Old Business**

Chairman Twine stated Sanford Ward, J. E. Harrell, Timothy Jordan and Ronnie Parker have stated an interest in serving on the Gates County Medical Transportation Board.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to open the floor for nominations to the Medical Transportation Board. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan nominated Ronnie Parker to serve on the Medical Transportation Board.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to close the nominations. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to appoint Ronnie Parker to the Gates County Medical Transportation Board. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Billy Winn, Emergency Management Director, presented a report on actions taken during the recent state of severe weather.

Chairman Twine presented the subject of Sunbury School being marketed by Preservation North Carolina. Claudia Deviney, Director, Northeast Regional Office, Preservation North Carolina was present. Commissioner Jernigan stated he would like for the County to keep the gymnasium for community use.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to move forward with Preservation North Carolina marketing Sunbury School and have the County Manager and Attorney put together an agreement and return to the Board for a final vote. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jordan presented the Proposed Noise Ordinance; he would like for the Board to move forward and have a public hearing.

Ed Webb, Sheriff, stated he had spoken with the County's district attorney regarding the Proposed Noise Ordinance. The district attorney requested the County have established decibel guidelines for enforcement and funding for calibration kits. The wording needs to be clarified so the sheriff's department, attorneys, district attorney and judge can enforce the ordinance. The County's attorney will discuss with the district attorney and judge to satisfy their text concerns. Commissioner Jordan requested the County Manager work with the County's attorney on this effort. Commissioner Askew stated he would like to have farm and forestry equipment removed from the proposed noise ordinance.

Toby Chappell, County Manager, presented the second CDBG Grant Public Hearing for the \$245,000 wastewater grant.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to open the CDBG Grant Public Hearing. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

J. E. Harrell questioned where did the amount \$245,000 come from?

Chairman Twine stated it was from the recommendation of the County's grant writer.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to close the CDBG Grant Public Hearing. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to allow Mike Scott, grant writer, to proceed with the \$245,000 CDBG grant. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

#### **New Business**

Roy Wilson, Director, East Carolina Behavioral Health, presented an update of services provided to the 19 counties in their service area. Joy Futrell, Finance Officer, East Carolina Behavioral Health, discussed the approved budget.

Doris Hawkins and Colleen Taylor, representatives from Albemarle Hopeline, discussed the services provided for County citizens. Chairman Twine read a Proclamation by Governor Perdue declaring October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

Veronica Creech, representative from Nurse-Family Partnership, discussed a program available for first time low income mothers; currently serving ten (10) counties. This program is implemented through the health department. Jerry Parks, Gates County Health Department Director, will need to respond.

Mr. Chappell presented a contract from LS3P for engineering services for the proposed new main library.

Commissioner Jordan stated he was still of the same opinion, he would like the citizens to have input into this decision.

Commissioner Nickens stated he was not against the library but against a potential tax increase.

Commissioner Askew stated he believes the County should go forward.

Commissioner Jernigan stated he is in favor a new library. He is trying to do something great for the County that the citizens need; part of an educational process for all ages.

Chairman Twine stated a library is an investment in the County. This would be a prosperous movement and the County needs to invest in it.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to move forward with the LS3P contract. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. Chairman Twine, Commissioners Jernigan

and Askew voted for the motion. Commissioners Nickens and Jordan voted against the motion. Motion carried by a majority vote.

Mr. Chappell presented Budget Amendment 25 to support the LS3P contract.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to approve Budget Amendment 25. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion. Chairman Twine and Commissioners Jernigan and Askew voted for the motion. Commissioners Nickens and Jordan voted against the motion. Motion carried by a majority vote.

Mr. Chappell discussed the site selection for a new library. The County does not own suitable property and the Town of Gatesville is not interested in purchasing property for the location of a library.

Commissioner Jernigan stated he would like to have the property in front of the high school, Merchants Commerce, explored as a possible library location and also explore the possibility of property in Gatesville.

Mr. Chappell will pursue site selection options.

Mr. Chappell stated he is continuing to work on the policy regarding timeliness of invoices.

Mr. Chappell presented a contract from Cavanaugh and Associates for wastewater engineering services.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the contract with Cavanaugh and Associates for wastewater engineering services. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Chappell presented Budget Amendment 19 to support the contract with Cavanaugh and Associates.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to approve Budget Amendment 19. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Chappell presented a contract between North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources and Gates County.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to accept the contract with North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine presented a request to re-appoint Abrom Saunders to the EIC Board for a one year term, September 1, 2010 to August 31, 2011.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to re-appoint Abrom Saunders to the EIC Board for a one year term. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine presented a Resolution requesting North Carolina Department of Transportation review the superstreet concept in regards to the US 13-158 widening project.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the Resolution for the Proposed Project Widening US 13-158 in Hertford and Gates Counties with a text addition. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Resolution, with text addition, reads as follows:

**RESOLUTION  
FOR THE PROPOSED PROJECT WIDENING US 13-158  
IN HERTFORD AND GATES COUNTIES**

WHEREAS, due to the proposed project of widening US 13-158 from US 158/NC 45 near Winton in Hertford County to US 158 at Tarheel in Gates County from two (2) travel lanes to four (4) travel lanes including a median, and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation is recommending an expressway or superstreet concept type of roadway be recommended for this project, and

WHEREAS, the superstreet concept prohibits minor cross-street traffic from going straight through or left at a divided highway intersection, and

WHEREAS, with the superstreet concept minor cross street traffic must turn right, then access a U-turn to proceed in the desired direction, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners does not feel the superstreet concept has the safety of Gates County's citizens foremost and first in this consideration.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Gates County Board of Commissioners would like to have the North Carolina Department of Transportation review the superstreet concept in regards to the Proposed Project of Widening US 13-158 in Hertford and Gates Counties and propose other means of directing traffic at intersections and side roads. The Board of Commissioners is specifically concerned with the superstreet concept as it relates to fire department vehicles, EMS vehicles and heavy industrial traffic.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to exit Closed Session and enter Regular Session. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.
