

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
MARCH 4, 2009**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Wednesday, March 4, 2009 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville, NC. Commissioners Jordan, Jernigan, Askew, Nickens and Twine were present. Also present was County Manager, Toby Chappell.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order, conducted a prayer and led the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Twine made a motion to approve the Agenda as presented. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve the February 2, 2009 Minutes as written. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to approve the February 27, 2009 Minutes as written. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Scheduled Appointments

Randall Cahoon, Director of Planning and Development, stated the public comment period has ended on the FEMA Flood Plan Maps. He requested a public hearing date be set.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to have the public hearing on May 18. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Cahoon stated the time has expired for Mr. Jerry Miller to clean up his site on highway 13 to be in compliance with the County's Junk Ordinance. The court order states the site is to be cleared and re-seeded. Mr. Rudy Lozano, R. L. Metals Demolishing and Trucking, Edenton, has agreed to donate his services to assist in clearing the property. He can possibly complete the work in one to one and one-half weeks. Mr. Lozano is donating the proceeds from the sell of scrap metal to Mr. Miller as well as providing housing.

Mr. Cahoon is asking the Commissioners to delay for at least 30 days pursuing the issue.

Toby Chappell, County Manager, stated he would write a letter to Judge McCoy requesting a delay.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to extend for 30 days pursuing the Junk Ordinance issue with Jerry Miller. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Cahoon stated at the February 17, 2009 Planning Board Meeting, the Planning Board approved two rezoning requests for Kenny Buck, Rooks Landing West and Paige Riddick Major Subdivisions. The Planning Board requests a public hearing date be scheduled for these requests. Also Frances Selwin, owning neighboring property, is requesting his property be rezoned also Agricultural to R-1. The plan fits into the CAMA Core Land Use Plan Update for Gates County.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to set a public hearing date at the Commissioners' Meeting on May 18. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Cahoon presented a Resolution removing himself as Review Officer and Subdivision Administrator and Wes Haskett, Interim County Planner, shall serve as Review Officer and Subdivision Administrator and Renee McGinnis, Tax Assessor, shall continue to serve as Deputy Review Officer in the County Planner's absence.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to adopt the Resolution removing Mr. Cahoon as Review Officer and Subdivision Administrator and Wes Haskett, Interim County Planner shall serve as Review Officer and Subdivision Administrator and Renee McGinnis, Tax Assessor, will continue to serve as Deputy Review Officer. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION
REMOVING FORMER EMPLOYEE AS REVIEW OFFICER AND
SUBDIVISION ADMINISTRATOR AND NAMING REPLACEMENTS

WHEREAS, NCGS § 47-30.2 requires the Board of County Commissioners in each County, by resolution, to appoint a person to serve as Review Officer to review each plat before it is recorded and certify that it meets the statutory requirements for recording; and

WHEREAS, Randall K. Cahoon, as County Planner, has served both as Review Officer and as Subdivision Administrator since December 5, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Renee McGinnis is appointed to serve as Deputy Review Officer to assist in map review during times of the County Planner's absence; and

WHEREAS, Randall K. Cahoon will no longer be employed by Gates County Government after 5:00 P.M. on March 5, 2009; and

WHEREAS, contract employees serving as County Planner will be named by the Board of Commissioners to serve in an Interim capacity until a permanent County Planner is hired;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, effective March 6, 2009 the Interim County Planner, Wes Haskett, shall serve in the capacity of both Subdivision Administrator and Review Officer, and Renee McGinnis shall continue to serve in the capacity of Deputy Review Officer during periods of absence of the Interim County Planner.

Curtis Chamblee, from Eure, presented a concern with the requirement that delinquent taxes have to be paid prior to being able to get a mechanical permit for a heating system upgrade to his home. He was under the impression his mortgage company had been paying his property taxes. The taxes have not been paid. The current amount of taxes is \$3,030.09, penalties and interest bring the total to \$4,655.07.

Mrs. McGinnis, Tax Assessor, stated she has spoken with Mr. Chamblee regarding the delinquent tax issue in the past; this is a two year old issue. A payment plan had been set up. To date Mr. Chamblee has only paid \$100.00 towards the back taxes.

Chairman Jordan stated according to NCGS 105.381, the Commissioners can only act if this is a clerical error.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to allow Mr. Chamblee to get a mechanical permit to install a heating system. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to have the County Manager obtain clarification regarding "clerical error". If the "clerical error" references the local tax office, penalties and interest may be waived; if not the taxes will have to be paid as stated. Mr. Chamblee needs to set up a payment plan with the tax office, if the payment plan is not followed, collection procedures will be pursued. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Old Business

Chairman Jordan discussed Colleen Turner's request the Americorp volunteer from Elizabeth City State University, assisting with the administration of the housing committee, be allowed to use the county vehicle.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to allow the Americorp volunteer from Elizabeth City State University to use the county vehicle, according to the department of social services travel policy, when the Elizabeth City State University's allotment has been exhausted. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion for a ten minute recess. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to enter back into regular session. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

New Business

Toby Chappell, County Manager, presented a resolution opposing a proposed Navy outlying landing field (OLF). This is the same resolution previously adopted; this resolution will represent the current Board.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to adopt the resolution opposing a proposed Navy outlying landing field (OLF) as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION OPPOSING A PROPOSED NAVY OUTLYING LANDING FIELD (OLF)

Whereas, Governor Easley formed a study group charged with examining and reporting on the strategic, environmental and economic impacts of a proposed Navy outlying landing field (OLF) in North Carolina in February of 2004; and

Whereas, the Navy has proposed two new potential OLF sites in Northeast North Carolina; and

Whereas, the Navy reported to the OLF Study Group that the proposed OLF would be used primarily by aircraft stationed at Oceana Air Station at Virginia Beach, Virginia and not at Cherry Point Marine Corps Air Station at Havelock, North Carolina; and

Whereas, Northeast North Carolina would not recognize any benefits from an OLF at either of these proposed sites; and

Whereas, Northeast North Carolina would only receive detrimental impacts on our citizens should an OLF be located in the region.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, the Gates County Board of Commissioners opposes locating a new outlying landing field in Gates County or Northeast North Carolina.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion requesting Chairman Jordan write a letter to Governor Beverly Perdue stating the county's opposition to an OLF and to schedule an open meeting in Gates County to meet with the general public. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Chappell stated the Northeastern Workforce Investment Consortium needs a Commissioner to represent Gates County.

Chairman Jordan stated a representative from the Northeastern Workforce needs to come to the March 16 Board meeting to discuss their concerns for this appointment.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to table the Northeastern Workforce Investment Consortium concerns until the March 16 meeting. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Chappell stated the Albemarle Regional Health Services Mosquito Program needs to know if Gates County would like to participate in the program next year.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to table the issue of participating with the Albemarle Regional Health Services Mosquito Program next year until a budget work session. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Chappell discussed a letter from Governor Beverly Perdue stating the February allotment of the Lottery and ADM Funds will be withheld. Sales taxes are already reduced. There is a projected \$433,416.00 shortfall for the rest of the fiscal year. Mr. Chappell presented four (4) recommendations for budget reductions and to re-evaluate the situation in April: (1) purchase and travel restrictions enforced immediately, (2) adjust budgets for each department to 58%, (3) a retroactive Medicaid payment of \$61,240.00 is due to be received, and (4) implement an immediate hiring freeze. Upon Board approval, these recommendations could bring \$315,000 back to the General Fund, with \$117,000 to be made up by June 30.

Commissioner Jernigan stated he had a concern with the hiring freeze affecting the Register of Deeds Office; by law, a Deputy Register of Deeds has to be in that office. Commissioner Jernigan also stated he would give half of his monthly salary back to the County.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to adopt Mr. Chappell's budget constraint recommendations as modified. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented budget amendments 50 – 58.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to approve budget amendments 50 – 53 and 55 – 58 as presented. Budget amendment 54 will be tabled until each department head has been consulted and return with it to the March 16 meeting.

Chairman Jordan presented a letter from the Department of Commerce in reference to the Audit Report and requested a letter of response be issued.

Public Comment

Paulette Wester voiced her concern regarding revaluation. Citizens will not be able to pay their taxes at the current tax rate. The 97.5% tax rate needs to be reduced.

Chairman Jordan responded he felt the tax rate will be lowered.

Ann Askew, representative to the Tourism Board, stated she had attended five tourism meetings. She plans to get new photos of points of interest in the county and possibly work on a new brochure.

Jeff Simmons, 53 Savage Road, stated he has a concern with the convenience sites. When dumpsters are full you have to dump your trash over the top. He would like to have a set of stairs or a ramp to aid in dumping trash into the dumpsters.

Brad Gardner, Manager of the convenience sites, stated this concern has been discussed previously. A platform would cost approximately \$6,400 each. He is in the process of working on next year's budget. The platform cost was removed from last year's budget but it could be put in for capital outlay for next year. All of the counties are not interested in a platform.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion for a brief recess. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to enter back into regular session. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to enter into closed session authorized by NCGS 143-318.11(a)(6). Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to exit closed session and enter into regular session. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to accept \$30,000 from the Board of Education for allocated ADM funds. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to recess until 7:00 p.m., March 16, 2009 in the main court room, Gates County Courthouse. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.
