

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
MAY 6, 2009**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Wednesday, May 6, 2009 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville, NC. With the attendance being greater than the Commissioners' Room could accommodate, Chairman Jordan moved the meeting to the main courtroom. Commissioners Jordan, Askew, Nickens and Twine were present. Commissioner Jernigan was absent. Also present was County Manager, Toby Chappell, and County Attorney, Pitt Godwin.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order. A prayer was led by Rev. Eugene Fields. Chairman Jordan led the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve the April 1, 2009 Meeting Minutes as written. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to approve the April 16, 2009 Meeting Minutes as written. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve the Agenda as presented. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Toby Chappell, County Manager, presented a new format and procedure for an entity to be placed under the new business portion of the agenda.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to accept the new format and procedure to be placed under the new business portion of the agenda. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The new procedure reads as follows:

Points of Emphasis:

- The process for an entity to be placed under the new business portion of the agenda is as follows: In writing contact Diane Hendrix, Clerk to the Board of Commissioners at P.O. Box 148 Gatesville, NC 27938. The Clerk will clarify the topic in which you plan to discuss and arrange to have any written materials made available to the Commissioners and the public. You will need to make contact with the Clerk at least two weeks prior to the meeting date. This is to ensure that your information is received and distributed prior to the meeting.
- The New and Old Business sections are strictly for County business. This is for information that needs to be brought to the attention of the Board of Commissioners for their deliberation and resolution. This is not a section that can be used by private citizens for the sole purpose of evading the time limit of the Citizen Comment section. For both the New and Old Business sections the presenter will be held to a strict **ten minute** time limit. This limit may be waived by the Chairman of the Board, or by a majority vote of the Board of Commissioners that will be taken at the ten minute time limit. After ten minutes the presenter will be notified of the time and allowed to complete the presentation within a specified time or stopped by the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners.
- In each and all of the sections of the meeting an environment of respect and professionalism will not only be expected, it will be required. If a presenter, in any portion of the meeting, shall become unruly or act in any manner that is in contradiction to the good order of the Board, as solely deemed by the Chairman of

the Board of Commissioners, the Chairman shall call down the presenter. If after being called down the unruly behavior persists, the Chairman has the sole authority under North Carolina General Statute 143-318.17 to direct the presenter to leave the meeting room. If the presenter fails to leave the meeting room the Chairman has the authority to have the Sheriff arrest the presenter under the aforementioned General Statute.

- The Citizen Comment section is not only a hallmark of democratic government it is also a statutory requirement. To that end, the Citizen Comment section will be a portion of all public regular monthly meetings. For a citizen to be placed on the Citizen Comment section they can either contact the Clerk to the Board of Commissioners prior to the meeting or register themselves the day of the meeting by signing the form in the meeting room. Presenters in the Citizen Comment section will be held to the same requirements of respect and professionalism that is required in other sections of the agenda. Additionally, each citizen will be given only three minutes to make their comments; as allowed by North Carolina General Statute 153A-52.1. After this time has expired they will be called down by the Chairman. If they do not end their comments the process as outlined above for unruly presenters will be followed.

Department Reports

Billy Winn, Director of Communications, presented a contract from Embarq to upgrade the E-911 equipment.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to accept the contract from Embarq to upgrade the E-911 equipment. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Winn presented a Resolution for the Adoption of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the local standard for the management of routine and catastrophic emergencies. Every municipality in the United States is required to adopt a form of this Resolution.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to adopt the Resolution for the Adoption of the National Incident Management System. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the President of the United States in homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity;

WHEREAS, the collective input and guidance from all Federal, State, local and tribal homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, local and tribal emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, local and tribal organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification

standards, uniform standards for planning training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters;

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the County's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local and state agency readiness, maintain first responder safety and streamline incident management processes;

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management activities throughout the County as required by the Gates County Emergency Operations Plan;

WHEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System;

THEREFORE, the Gates County Board of Commissioners hereby establishes the National Incident Management Systems as the local standard for the management of routine and catastrophic emergencies.

Adopted, this the 6th day of May, 2009.

Mr. Winn presented a Resolution to designate an agent to accept a \$22,500 refund from the Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. The primary agent will be County Manager, Toby Chappell, and the secondary agent will be the Director of Communications, Billy Winn.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to adopt the Resolution designating County Manager, Toby Chappell, as the primary agent and Director of Communications, Billy Winn, as secondary agent to accept funds from the Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Renee McGinnis, Tax Assessor, presented the April Tax Collector's Report. The County currently has a 90.84% collection rate. The Tax Office is in the process of compiling records to send to Travis Ellis for collection procedures. Mr. Ellis suggest a payment plan be scheduled for individuals in need of a plan but not to have the time frame exceed four (4) months. Mr. Ellis currently has 36 records.

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendments 70-82.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to accept Budget Amendments 70-82 as presented. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Reba Greene-Holley, Cooperative Extension Director, invited the Commissioners to the County Commissioners' Luncheon scheduled for August 5. She also introduced the new 4-H Agent, Portia Bradley.

Mr. Chappell presented a request from Colleen Turner, Social Services Directors, to lift the hiring freeze for an ARRA-funded DSS position. Stimulus funds have been allocated for this position; there will be no expense to the County.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to lift the temporary hiring freeze for the ARRA-funded DSS position. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Ed Webb, Sheriff, presented a request for surplus and disposition of assets. He has five vehicles, all in excess of 150,000 miles, and would like to have a sale or auction to dispose of them.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to allow the Sheriff and other departments to dispose of surplus equipment through an auction and Gov Deals. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Old Business

Mr. Chappell stated Commissioner Jernigan is currently serving on the East Carolina Behavioral Health Board, a citizen also needs to be appointed to serve on this board.

Commissioner Twine nominated David Brown to serve on the East Carolina Behavioral Health Board, Commissioner Nickens seconded the nomination.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to close the nominations.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to appoint David Brown as the citizen representative to the East Carolina Behavioral Health Board. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Board reconvened after a brief recess.

New Business

Gayle Olson, Pediatric Asthma Care Manager, Albemarle Regional Health Services, and Carolina Chappell, State Asthma Director, thanked the County for implementing the Air Quality Flag Program. Chelsea Smith, a fourth grader at Buckland Elementary School, read a statement on how asthma affects her life. Chairman Jordan read a Proclamation proclaiming May as Asthma Awareness Month.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to adopt the Proclamation proclaiming May as Asthma Awareness Month. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Proclamation reads as follows:

**PROCLAMATION
FOR
ASTHMA AWARENESS MONTH
MAY 2009**

WHEREAS, asthma and allergic diseases annually result in physical, emotional and economic hardship for more than thirty million Americans and their families; and

WHEREAS, asthma is a long-term, inflammatory disease in which the airways of the lungs constrict, causing wheezing, breathlessness, chest tightness, and coughing; and

WHEREAS, exposure to allergens and irritants such as dust mites, mold, pet dander, pollen and secondhand smoke can bring on an asthma episode; and

WHEREAS, asthma is the leading cause of childhood hospitalizations, long-term illness and school absenteeism, accounting for more than 300,000 missed school days; and

WHEREAS, there are simple steps the community can take to reduce their exposure to environments triggers to asthma; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the significant importance of increased public awareness of recent advancements in the study of immunology to the health and well-being of millions of American children and adults;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Henry Jordan, Gates County Commissioner Chairman, do hereby proclaim the month of May 2009 as "**ASTHMA AWARENESS MONTH**" in Gates County and

urge all citizens to identify and reduce their exposure to environmental triggers in homes and schools.

Dr. Zenobia Smallwood, Superintendent of Gates County Schools, Mike Conner, Assistant Superintendent, and Dale Saunders, Chairman of the Board, and Rube Blanchard, Finance Officer, presented the 2009-2010 Budget of \$248,048.60. This year's budget does not have any salary increases and contains numerous cutbacks. Last year the State requested Gates County Schools return \$78,000. This year they have been requested to return \$55,000.

Chairman Jordan asked Mr. Saunders to provide the Commissioners with line item breakdowns for their Budget.

Mr. Conner asked the Board to appropriate 100,000.00, the same as last year.

Chairman Jordan stated the Board of Education's request will be considered and the Commissioners should have an answer for them by the June meeting.

Earl Rountree, voiced his concern with how to be placed on the Commissioners' agenda. The current procedure states a request should be placed two (2) weeks in advance. He is requesting this time be reduced. He also stated each Commissioner needs to follow the rules set forth in the Commissioner's Handbook.

Paulette Wester, questioned the County's Affirmative Action and hiring policies.

Mr. Chappell read the County's Equal Opportunity Policy and hiring policy from the Personnel Handbook.

Chairman Jordan stated the County Manager appoints the interview team for all positions other than positions working under elected officials. The Board is made aware of all hiring decisions and felt the County does a good job with their hiring process.

Whalyn Jordan, Deacon and President, Gates County Chapter of the NAACP, introduced Roger Vann Smith, Deacon to the NC Chapter of the NAACP Legal Redress Committee. Mr. Smith read a Resolution adopted by Chapter 5396 in opposition to and for reconsideration of the proposed 2009 Notices of Assessed Values throughout Gates County.

Commissioner Jordan stated the revaluations performed were done according to North Carolina law. The Board does not have the authority to rescind them and the Board of Equalization and Review is already in place.

Chairman Jordan stated Mrs. Shirley Grimes attended a meeting in Raleigh for senior citizens. At the time she made the arrangements the County had implemented a travel freeze. She is requesting \$137 reimbursement for hotel expenses.

Commissioner Nickens stated Mrs. Grimes went to Raleigh as an advocate for the senior citizens of the County.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to table this decision until a full Board was in attendance. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Citizen Comments

John Wester, White Oak Road, Eure, relinquished his time to his wife, Paulette.

Mrs. Wester stated according to Robert's Rules of Order, anyone could relinquish their time to someone else, therefore the speaker could accumulate more time to speak.

Chairman Jordan stated the Commissioners set the rules for their meetings and did not necessarily have to abide by Robert's Rules of Order.

Virginia Moore asked the Chairman what were the rules of order established at the first meeting when the Chairman took office.

Chairman Jordan stated the rules of order were in accordance with the general statutes set out by the North Carolina Institute of Government. He then told Mrs. Moore her question would be delayed at this time. As Mrs. Moore began to dispute the Chairman he asked her to sit down and allow the meeting to go forward.

Commissioners Nickens commented it is suggested in the Institute of Local Government Handbook to have a spokesperson designated for each group of citizens.

Paulette Wester, White Oak Road, Eure, voiced her concern with the increase on property values and revaluation should be performed every four (4) years instead of eight (8) years. She feels property is not being viewed properly.

Cleo Craddock, Hwy 137, Eure, stated she would like for the Commissioners to reduce the tax rate. She also has a concern about property in her community that is to be used for a private cemetery. She would like for the Commissioners to review this concern.

The meeting reconvened after a brief recess.

Roger Vann Smith, stated GS 153A-149 gives commissioners lots of flexibility to bridge any budget gap. The current tax issues will be devastating for some citizens.

Cathy Malaspina, relinquished her time to George Walters.

George Walters, voiced his concern in opposition of the increased tax values and wanted to know how the tax rate is going to be reduced enough to keep citizens from paying as much as last year.

Tommy Langston and Cathy Malaspina relinquished their public comment time to George Walters. Marion Byrd, Ralph Roscoe, Curtis Whitley, Karen Boone, Irma Grant, Eula Eure, and Michael Wells relinquished their public comment time to Paulette Wester. Sharon Jones relinquished her public comment time to Penny Heishman.

Mrs. Wester voiced her concern with the current appraisals, the firm conducting the appraisals, Schedule of Values and Standards and Rules.

Joe Greene, Eure, questioned when the tax rate was going to be determined.

Mr. Chappell stated the tax rate will be set by July 1, when the Budget Ordinance is adopted.

Estelle Blanton, Sunbury, representing eight (8) landowners with 38 parcels, voiced opposition to the current appraisals.

Robert Ezel, Pearson's Appraisal Service, stated by law property has to be revalued every eight (8) years and has to be valued at 100%. A public hearing was held as required by law. The current sales ratio study states property is valued at 99.5%.

John Wester, Eure, voiced his concern with the large number of citizens with unpaid taxes.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, wanted to know the tax neutral rate and voiced his concern with taxes.

Mr. Chappell stated the tax neutral rate will be posted in the next two to three weeks.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to recess the meeting until 7:00 pm on Monday, May 18, 2009. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.
