

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
OCTOBER 3, 2012**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, October 3, 2012 in the main courtroom, 202 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Twine, Jordan, Hora, and Jernigan were present. Also present was County Manager, Toby Chappell.

Vice-Chairman Jordan led a prayer and pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Twine called the meeting to order.

Approval of Agenda

Chairman Twine stated the Agenda will be amended by adding a Closed Session authorized by NCGS §143-318.11(a)(6).

Commissioner Owens enters the meeting.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to approve the Agenda as amended. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the September 5, 17 and 26 Minutes as written. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Citizens' Comments

Dan Lang, Gatesville, stated economic changes are taking place too fast in the County and he would like to slow down the process.

Gene Bricker, McLean Contractors, stated he is applying for a variance/special use permit for a double-wide for office space and would like assistance expediting the permits. The Planning Director stated she was assisting him with his request.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, requested the Board review electronic banking for paying water bills. He is in support of reducing the number of water meter readings and paying an additional amount towards the DSS loan.

Sidney Pierce, Hobbsville, stated the Democratic Party has been in control for 140 years and Gates County is one of the poorest in the state; he is supporting voting a Republican ticket in November.

Thomas Hill, Sunbury, stated the Democratic Party has been in charge of the County for several years. He stated Commissioner Jordan has not commented on a JROTC, re-evaluation of homes or taxation, changed his mind on library issues and he has been challenged to a debate.

Commissioner Jordan responded he has talked to Dr. Williams, Superintendent, and Gates County Schools has submitted an application for a JROTC program. It has been his objective to keep the tax rate low; there has been no increase in three (3) years. Regarding the library, the majority dictates on how the Board proceeds with a 3/2 vote. He voted on financing for the library to get the best rate possible. Debates are held to discuss specific issues and he sees no need for a debate.

Department Reports

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendments 13-18.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to approve Budget Amendments 13-18 as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Pittman presented a Grant Project Ordinance for the Urgent Repair Program Grant Project.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to accept the Grant Project Ordinance for \$75,000 for the Urgent Repair Project Grant. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Grant Project Ordinance reads as follows:

**COUNTY OF GATES
GRANT PROJECT ORDINANCE
URGENT REPAIR PROGRAM GRANT PROJECT**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Gates County Board of Commissioners that pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the North Carolina General Statutes, the following Project Ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1. The project authorized is the 2012 Urgent Repair Project (URP 12) through the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency. The project is known as the URP for internal communications.

Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with the project within the terms of the agreements and documents related to same.

Section 3. The following revenue source is anticipated to be available to complete this project:

Section 4. The following amounts are appropriated for this project:

Section 5. The Finance Officer is hereby directed to maintain within the Project Fund sufficient detailed accounting records to satisfy the requirements of all funding sources.

Section 6. The Finance Officer is directed to report the financial status of each project element on a monthly basis via regular written monthly reports.

Section 7. The Budget Officer is directed to include a detailed analysis of past and future costs and revenues on this capital project in every annual budget submission made to the Commissioners during the duration of the project.

Section 8. Copies of this Project Ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Board, Budget Officer, and Finance Officer for direction in carrying out this project.

Section 9. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 10. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

Renee McGinnis, Tax Administrator, presented the September Tax Collectors Report and a bid for property Parcel No. 03-00304 for \$300.00

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to go forward and accept the bid as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Morgan Jethro, Planning Director, discussed Special Use Permits for Manufactured Homes in R-1 zoning.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to open the Public Hearing for Special Use Permits for Manufactured Homes in R-1 zoning. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Dan Bazemore, Eure, stated in his neighborhood a home lot is valued at \$43,000 for one (1) acre which he feels is some of the highest in the County; tax value and appraised property value are two different items.

T.C. Vaughan, Eure, stated his home built in 1980 is now worth three times more, the tax value has increased. He owns a mobile home. The tax value on his house is 41 times greater than his mobile home.

Linda Hofler, Hobbsville, Planning Board member, stated she does not want to rush this issue; 2007 statistics state 42% of the homes in Gates County were manufactured. It is important to secure core villages and to look at the fee schedule. This text amendment change needs to be reviewed thoroughly.

Chuck Brothers, Gates, Planning Board member, stated there are issues in the County. This cannot be fixed quickly. The core villages need to be declared and the Planning Board needs to be empowered to make the necessary text changes.

Joe Greene, Eure, Planning Board member, requested to give the Planning Board time to perform their job correctly.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, questioned who has the right to tell someone they cannot live in a mobile home. A definition for spot zoning is needed.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to close the Public Hearing. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to allow the Planning Board to bring back a recommendation for manufactured homes in R-1 zoning and core community overlay. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine presented a plaque of recognition to T.C. Vaughan for his years of service on the Gates County Planning Board.

Chairman Twine called the meeting to order after a brief recess.

Old Business

Fred Belledin, Clearscapes Architects, gave an update on the Courthouse Renovation Project.

Commissioner Jordan discussed the applications received for the Courthouse Renovation Committee.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to appoint the following applicants to the Courthouse Renovation Committee: Commissioners Jordan, Owens and Hora, Marie Allen, Anthony Felton, Linda Hofler, Sidney Pierce, Edith Seiling, Adam Williams, Barbara Toti, Thomas Hill and Susan Shultis. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion. Commissioners Jordan and Hora voted for the motion. Chairman Twine and Commissioners Owens and Jernigan voted against the motion. The motion did not carry.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to appoint the following applicants to the Courthouse Renovation Committee: Marie Allen, Linda Hofler, Sidney Pierce, Edith Seiling, Susan Shultis, Barbara Toti, Adam Williams and Thomas Hill. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion that Commissioner Jordan act as moderator at the first organizational meeting of the Courthouse Renovation Committee. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

New Business

Chairman Twine read a Resolution Honoring the USS Indianapolis (CA-35) and Crew.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to adopt the Resolution as presented. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Resolution Honoring the USS Indianapolis (CA-35) and Crew reads as follows:

RESOLUTION HONORING THE USS INDIANAPOLIS (CA-35) AND CREW

WHEREAS, The U.S.S. Indianapolis served as the delivery vehicle for the world's first ever functioning atomic bomb to the Island of Tinian on July 26, 1945,

WHEREAS, After completion of this mission, which was severely dangerous yet necessary, the ship set out on its next mission from Guam to the Philippines on July 29, 1945,

WHEREAS, At 14 minutes past midnight on July 30, 1945 the U.S.S. Indianapolis was attacked by Japanese submarines,

WHEREAS, As a result of this attack, of the 1,196 on board, only 900 entered the water as the ship sank and only 317 of those survived the nearly five days in a shark infested ocean,

WHEREAS, Of these 317 patriots that survived this horrendous ordeal one of them was Gates County's own F.J. Outland, Sr.,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners for the County of Gates hereby honors the sacrifice of those lost due to this terrible act and furthermore recognize the living legend and priceless treasure that is Mr. F.J. Outland, Sr. As a mere token of appreciation and as a resolute mandate we order that a rendering of the U.S.S. Indianapolis and a marker denoting the accomplishment of F.J. Outland, Sr. be placed in a position of prominence in a County facility.

May the people of this great County, State, and Nation never forget the sacrifices made by the U.S.S. Indianapolis nor the value that F.J. Outland, Sr. has made during his life to the freedom and security that we as American Citizens' possess.
