

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
APRIL 6, 2016**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, April 6, 2016 in the Gates County Court House, 200 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Hofler, Owens, Jordan, Felton and Freeman were present. Also present was County Manager, Natalie Rountree.

Commissioner Jordan led in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Hofler called the meeting to order.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the minutes as modified for March 2, 2016, March 21, 2016 work session and March 21, 2016 regular meeting. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Agenda

Chair Hofler stated item 7 on the agenda needs to be replaced with Board of Elections Budget Request and item 10, budget amendment, needs to be removed from the agenda.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Reba Green-Holley, Governor Volunteer Recognition, stated as the County Extension Director she was the representative for Gates County to solicit applications and send to the State for the Governors Volunteer Recognition program. Ms. Holley asked if the Board would like her to continue in the roll and if so she needs to be reappointed by the Board.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to reappoint Ms. Holley to be the Governors Volunteer Coordinator for Gates County for a two year period from 2016-2018. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Freeman asked for a list of recipients that have been selected in the past. Ms. Holley stated she has a list of all recent recipients but not all years past.

Ms. Holley stated Erin Riddick and Leanne Tyler helped to complete the application to nominate Jonathan Jones for the Governor Volunteer Recognition Award. There are about 20 individuals selected from across the State to receive the medallion award which is the highest award you can receive; he has been selected as a recipient. Mr. Jones has been the Gatesville PTA president and has raised \$22,000. He has also served as a Gates County 4-H & Cooperative Extension volunteer and Board Member. He has volunteered with Wounded Warriors for four years and serves on the DSS Board and Planning Board. He helped get the Chamber of Commerce running and coaches little league sports. Mr. Jones has been a benefit to all citizens in Gates County and possess a huge heart and compassion for people and is willing to give whatever is needed.

Administrative Reports

Natalie Rountree, County Manager, presented the managers' report for February 13-March 24, 2016. All departments and offices have been working on budget requests for FY17. They were due on March 15th. As of today, all but budgets have been received. Annual employee evaluations are due to the County Manager by April 15th. Mrs. Rountree continues to to answer calls from the public on many issues, work on tasks assigned by the Commissioners, and meet with staff to ensure the county is operating correctly. Mrs. Rountree, Ms. Hofler and Sheriff Webb attended a meeting at Albemarle Sentera concerning involuntary commitments on February 15th. Senator Cook and

Representative Steinburg attended as well as representatives from surrounding counties and Trillium. On March 9 JCPC held their quarterly meeting to discuss current year programming and FY17 funding. JCPC voted to fund Genesis, Restitution, and Alternatives for Youth.

Kathy Lane, Tax Administrator, presented the collectors report. The County is slightly above in collections for delinquent collections due to advertising efforts. Ms. Lane provided an update on Keystone which involves a database split relating to revaluation data entry. There are still some problems within the Tax Office involving Keystone that are not resolved. Commissioner Jordan said Ellis only has three properties which are continually accruing attorney fees and are properties that can't really be sold because of their size and/or land configuration. Commissioner Jordan asked if there is a way to get those three properties back from Ellis and work on them in house instead of accruing attorney fees. Ms. Lane stated some of the accounts date back to 2009 and have had no status changes. She agrees with the points that Commissioner Jordan makes and bringing the accounts back may be an option when the final information is received from Ellis to indicate the standing of the accounts and the amount of legal fees.

Commissioner Jordan recommended the Board send a letter to Ellis requesting a final status check and update on charges.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion for the Tax Administrator to draft a letter on behalf of the Board of Commissioners to Ellis requesting a final status update, updated charges, and a suspension of activity so there are no more charges. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion carried.

Ms. Lane presented a short update on the Jones Property, Zacheaus Legal Services has agreed to suspend activity for the time.

Chair Hofler stated it is Board of Equalization and Review time and the Board needs to pick dates that do not interfere with meetings.

The Board agreed to open the Board of Equalization and Review on April 25th at 4pm.

Ms. Lane stated there are no refunds this month but a letter has been received requesting interest be released on a parcel of land from 2009. Ms. Lane stated interested cannot be released unless there was a clerical error. Commissioner Owens feels the general statute clearly stated the interest cannot be released. Commissioner Jordan stated the Board must notify the taxpayer in writing on why it is not being refunded and the taxpayer has the option to bring a civil suit after 90 days. The letter needs to be clear that the Board is not authorized to release the charges due to the general statute.

Commissioner Freeman made a motion to send a certified letter to deny the request to release interest charged. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Chair Hofler commented that GITS fare collections are doing very well.

Commissioner Jordan asked on the Code Violations what the next step will be for the complaints that have gone beyond 60 days. Mr. Rountree stated she will defer this question until the May meeting when the Ordinance can be reviewed due to a recent court ruling.

There were no additional departmental questions.

Public Hearings

Old Business

Mrs. Rountree presented the final draft of the Solar Farm Ordinance for review by the Board of Commissioners. We have not received an answer about the bond and letter of credit that was brought up at the last meeting. This questions has been sent to a local banker

and we are waiting for a response. If the final draft is approved the Board will need to make a motion to move forward with a public hearing to be held at the May meeting because the moratorium will expire at the end of May. The information received from the banker can be added at the public hearing or we can amend the ordinance at a later date.

The Board decided to leave the draft as written with the intent on amending it at the public hearing once an answer can be received by the financial institution.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to move forward with a public hearing for the Solar Farm Ordinance to be held on May 4, 2016. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Chair Hofler stated College of The Albemarle has recommended the Board reappoint Graham Twine to serve on the Board of Trustees.

Commissioner Freeman made a motion to appoint Graham Twine to the College of The Albemarle Board of Trustees. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Chair Hofler stated Clearscapes has responded to the report given by WJE and agreed and disagreed with parts of the report. Clearscapes agree there should be material analysis and limited masonry testing. They recommended that we do not test the reclaimed brick that was recommended by WJE.

Mrs. Rountree stated the total cost will be \$7,600 to do the existing brick testing, stucco testing and mortar testing. Mrs. Rountree would like to clarify where WJE will get the existing bricks from since they crumble when you remove them and Clearscapes has recommended they come from various parts of the building.

Chair Hofler stated the Historical Society is concerned about the sunlight in the East Wing and they are looking at possibly installing some storm windows.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to ask WJE to proceed with mortar, stucco and existing brick testing. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Gladys Owens, Soil & Water Conservation, stated Gates County is one of thirteen counties in the State that does not participate in the Voluntary Agriculture District program. Gates County Soil and Water, Cooperative Extension and Planning Office would like to ask for approval to work on a Voluntary Agriculture District as well as develop a steering committee.

Commissioner Jordan asked if there are any obligations to the County. Ms. Owens stated there is not, often times there are grants to help with the signage and sometimes Farm Bureau will provide assistance. The Steering Committee will discuss all that is needed and help to secure things like grants.

Chair Hofler stated farmers may be able to get state and federal grants if the county has the classifications.

Commissioner Owens asked who will make up the steering committee. Ms. Owens said it will be made up of primarily farmers. Interested citizens will use the County Application to Apply and the Board of Commissioners will make the appointment.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to approve work on the Voluntary Agriculture District and the development of a Steering Committee. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Tim Hedgepeth, Water Department Director, stated MESCO has found two companies to put in bids to do underground research on where the I&I, ground water infiltration, issues are occurring. Once the issues are found contractors will provide bids on fixing the issues. One bid is around \$5,500 and the other is around \$5,700. Bids were based on total linear

footage, some of the footage has been eliminated by checks the county has done. Mr. Hedgepeth has requested that the research be done immediately following a heavy rain.

Commissioner Freeman asked if there are any ideas on what is causing the issues. Mr. Hedgepeth feels a large part of the issues is coming from the material that was used and the rocking that is under the piping.

Commissioner Freeman made a motion to approve an expenditure up to \$6,000 for a bid to find the I&I issues. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Mrs. Rountree stated the Board of Elections has requested additional funding for part time salaries and expenses for the June Election. Elections has very little money to move in their budget and the requested funds will come out of the Fund Balance. The funds will cover part time workers from March 16 to June 30, 2016

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve funding for part time salaries in the amount of \$3761.00 to be taken out of Fund Balance. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve funding for the June Election in the amount of \$12,000.00 to be taken out of fund balance. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Felton asked why so much money is needed for part time assistance. Mrs. Rountree explained that information will have to come from Mr. Hankinson. Commissioner Owens stated Mr. Hankinson may need to provide the Board with information from the State Board on the required hours that the office must be open.

Chair Hofler stated she is very concerned that the budget was submitted and fell short of the funds needed.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to direct the County Manager to contact Chuck Hankinson on the requirements for office hours from the State Board of Elections as well as details on the staffing of the office. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Freeman verified that all employees are required to turn in timesheets.

Mrs. Rountree presented a contract amendment for Holland Consulting.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve a contract amendment for Holland Consulting Planner for the Comprehensive Plan Contract in the amount not to exceed \$5,000.00. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion carried.

Mrs. Rountree presented the FY16 Audit Contract for this coming fiscal year and interim work to be completed. The audit is \$1,700.00 more than it cost last year.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the FY15/16 Audit Contract with Martin & Starnes. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion; motion carried.

Chair Hofler stated Commissioner Jordan's term for the DSS Board is up for reappointment and he is eligible for another term.

Commissioner Freeman made a motion to appoint Commissioner Henry Jordan to the DSS Board. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Chair Hofler explained the attorney for Graham and Brenda Hatch have asked the Board support their request for a road abandonment of the circle drive at the old Sunbury School. Commissioner Owens said it appears the Hatches are going through the appropriate methods to get the road abandoned so they can block it off.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to draft a resolution in support of the abandonment of secondary road 1339 by the State and become the property of Sunbury Fields. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

The Board discussed processes that will have to take place should the facility be renovated and opened in the future and a driveway with parking is needed.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to authorize the Chair to sign a resolution in support of the abandonment of secondary road 1339. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion carried.

Commissioner Owens requested the County Manager contact DOT about the requirements for them to take over Soney Lane. Mrs. Rountree believes they have refused in the past but will double check.

Commissioner Freeman thanked all citizens for being involved and contacting Board Members and sharing their visions and goals. You may not hear your comments in a public meeting but they are heard and reviewed.

Commissioner Felton thanked everyone for their attendance and Warren Curry for IT support. Brent Lane will be speaking at the Murfreesboro Library Thursday night at 6pm.

Commissioner Jordan thanked everyone for attending and being interested in how local government is run. The issues that are carried out in Washington DC start at a local level.

Commissioner Owens thanked everyone for attending and stated there are a lot of things going on in the State right now and when you hear about things that you approve or do not approve of you can always start by voicing your concerns at the podium at the local level.

Chair Hofler thanked everyone for attending and listening. All choices aren't easy and you can stay informed by attending meetings and watching the meetings once they are posted on the website.

Chair Hofler stated the Board will be traveling to the Vernon James Center for the yearly District Commissioners Meeting. It is an opportunity for the district to express concerns that need to be taken to our legislators.

Commissioner Felton stated the old town well behind Bubba Bundy is no longer in use and Mr. Bundy is interested in purchasing the property from the County.

Closed Session

Commissioner Owens made a motion to enter into Closed Session pursuant to NCGS 143-318.11 a (4) Economic Development. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to exit closed session. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Adjournment

Commissioner Felton made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.


